

Guest speakers



Professor Andrew McStay

Andrew McStay is Professor of Technology & Society at Bangor University and the author of *Automating Empathy: Decoding Technologies that Gauge Intimate Life*, published open access in 2024 with Oxford University Press. His work explores the ethical implications of AI systems claimed empathise and understand emotion. Director of the Emotional AI Lab, his current projects include Responsible AI (RAI) funded work to diversify regional input into IEEE-based ethical technical standards for emulated empathy and human-AI partnering (IEEE P7014.1). Other recent work includes a project for the Office of the Privacy Commissioner of Canada on child-focused emotional AI systems. He is also a technology advisory panel member for the UK's Information Commissioners' Office.



Dr Laura Thomas

Laura Thomas was scientifically trained at the University of Birmingham, UK (undergraduate) and Cardiff University (postgraduate) to understand the molecular mechanisms underlying tumour development in inherited tumour syndromes. Laura completed her postdoctoral studies and HCRW fellowship with Prof Julian Sampson at Cardiff University, School of Medicine. She has now established her own research group at Swansea University Medical School with a focus on intestinal tumour development in the inherited intestinal polyposis syndromes; Familial adenomatous Polyposis (FAP) and MUTYH associated polyposis (MAP).



Professor Amy Brown

Amy Brown is a Professor of Maternal and Child Health and directs the research centre 'LIFT' which stands for Lactation, Infant Feeding and Translational Research. Amy came to Swansea as an undergraduate student almost 25 years ago and forgot to leave. She went on to complete an MSc and PhD (during which she had three babies), alongside working in part time research and teaching roles across psychology, childhood studies, health sciences and adult education. In 2011 she became a full-time lecturer and progressed through to professor in 2018. Her work explores early parenting, particularly infant feeding and mental health. She has published over 100 papers, written 12 books, collaborated on research funding worth over 4 million, advised governments and health organisations around the world, and drives what is probably the world's only car that says 'urgent donor human milk' on the side in Welsh.
